<b>grid reference</b>	Numbers on a map that help you to find specific places.	<b>rural</b>	A location in the countryside. Includes mainly physical features.
<b>Ordnance Survey</b>	The company that makes official maps of Great Britain.	<b>urban</b>	A location in a town or city. Includes mainly human features.
<b>map symbol</b>	A picture on a map to represent common human and physical features.	<b>county</b>	Areas of land including cities, towns and villages. England has 48 counties, including N, S, E, W Yorkshire.
<b>United Kingdom</b>	The 4 countries of the UK are England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Island.	<b>aerial photograph</b>	A photograph of a place taken from above.

Key Knowledge:

- Yorkshire made up of 4 counties (North Yorkshire, The East Riding of Yorkshire, West Yorkshire and South Yorkshire).
- There are 7 cities in the county of Yorkshire; York, Leeds, Bradford, Sheffield, Wakefield, Ripon and Kingston Upon Hull.
