### Key Knowledge

Colonel Thomas Edward Lawrence, (16th August 1888 - 19th May 1935) was a British archaeologist, army officer, diplomat, and writer. He is most famous for his role in the Arab Revolt against the Ottoman Empire during the First World War.

He fought alongside Arab forces in the Middle East during the First World War. Britain always showed support for the Ottoman Empire in the Middle East however, this ended with Turkey's support of Germany in 1914. Looking to take advantage of the growing Arab nationalism, Britain encouraged and supported leading Arabs to revolt against the Ottoman colonial rule.

Amy Johnson was born on 1st July 1903 in Hull and mysteriously disappeared on 5th January 1941. She was a pioneering English pilot who was the first woman to fly solo from London to Australia in 1930, it took her 19 days. It was incredible achievement and to this day no other woman has made the journey solo.

On 5 January 1941, while flying from Blackpool to Oxford, Johnson went off course in terrible weather conditions. Reportedly out of fuel, she bailed out as her aircraft crashed into the Thames Estuary near Herne Bay.
