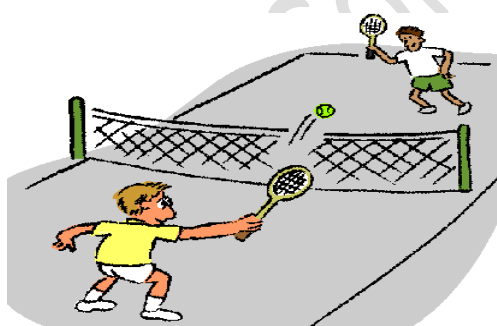

Bat and ball games are field games played by two teams. These teams take turns batting and fielding. The team that is batting can score. The team that is fielding is defending. In most games, a player on the fielding team puts a ball into play. Then a player on the batting team tries to hit the ball with a bat. The two most popular bat-and-ball games in the world are cricket and baseball.

Cricket is a bat and ball game played on a strip of grassy ground which is called the pitch. A cricket match is played between two teams of 11 players. One team bats and the other fields. A team's turn to bat or bowl is called an innings. If a batter hits the ball they can score runs. The team that scores the most runs wins the game.

Tennis is a sport played with a rubber ball, a racket and a court. There are different kinds of courts- grass, clay or sand. The goal of tennis is to hit the ball over the net using a racket into the other player's court. When the other player cannot return the ball, a point is won. The game is played with two or four people.
