Key Knowledge

- Puppetry is an ancient form of artistic expression that is a variation on storytelling or human theatrical productions. Puppetry as an art form is believed to have its roots in ancient cultures, more than 3000 years old.
- What types of puppets are there? Glove, finger, string, sock, rod...
- How can we attach decorations to our puppets? Glue, sewing, staples, Velcro...
- How can our puppets be made to move? Fingers/Hands, String, Rods
- Stick/rod puppets could be made from a range of materials and different types of cloth such as felt, cotton and card, dowling, lolly sticks....
- There are a variety of tools used to make a stick puppet- saw/glue gun/stapler/needle and thread.
- We can join materials together using glue/ staples/ sewing. Some tools such as saws can be dangerous.
- Before a product can be made it needs to be designed on paper or on computer. Designers talk about their products during the development process to improve their ideas
