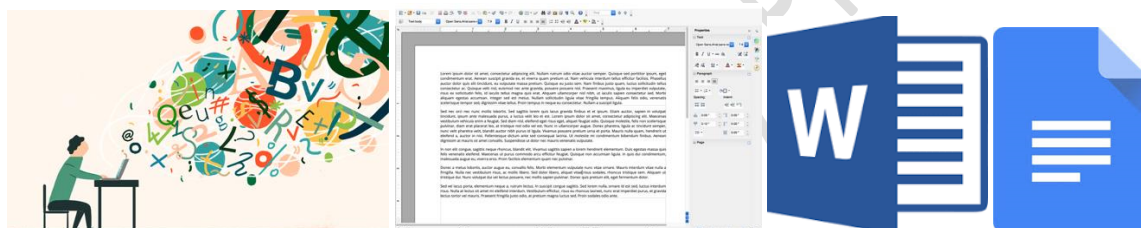

## Key Knowledge

- You can save **photos, music, videos, games** and lots of other things on a computer. If you have too many things stored the computer memory will get full. Different things take up different amounts of space
- You can make lots of things on a computer. You can make a picture, write a letter or draw a chart. It is important to save your work. Then you can come back to it another time. To save your work you need to give it a name. Then you click the 'save' button to store it safely on your computer.
- Some computers have a separate keyboard and a screen. Tablet computers have a keyboard that is part of the screen. If you wanted to type a story, you could use some 'word processing' software.
- When you write using a computer it is easy to fix mistakes and change how the words look too. When you have written your story you can change how it looks.
- Computers are everywhere today and they can do things very fast. In the past they were much slower and much bigger. Computers have changed a lot over time. There have been some important people who have helped change what computers can do: Charles Babbage, Ada Lovelace and Alan Turing.

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
