- People 100 years ago used carpet beaters and dustpans to clean rugs and carpets.
- People 100 years ago used weighing scales with real weights to weigh foods when cooking.
- During the past 100 years technology has evolved with the introduction of electricity. Inventions have been made to make cooking, cleaning and washing clothes easier such as the washing machine.
- Investigating real artefacts can tell us how life was in the past.
